STALLS: Show management will assign stalls on a first come, first served basis in the order in which entries are received. They will be available after 5:00 PM the day before the show. **NO STALLS WILL BE CHANGED** without Management approval. 195 stalls are available, so make your reservations early! Please consider sharing a tack stall with friends. **If sharing a tack stall, put that tack stall on one entry form, that designated person is responsible for the full \$60.** It is up to that designated person to collect the money. Show Management has the right to limit the number of tack stalls to provide stalls for horses. All reserved stalls must be paid for whether used or not.

- ✓ No feed or bedding will be provided. Contact Vince Melillo at 815-547-8631 to order shavings
- ✓ All pets must be confined or on a leash. Owner assumes all liability for pet animals.
- ✓ Trophy and 6 ribbons in each class.
- ✓ The judge's decision is FINAL.
- ✓ A two-minute gate rule will be enforced.
- ✓ All exhibitors wishing to run a tab **MUST** leave a blank, signed check with the show manager before receiving numbers.
- ✓ No veterinarian will be present on the show grounds.
- ✓ Entries in all classes must be shown with full mane and tail. Braids and inconspicuously applied hair in mane and tail are permitted in pleasure and in-hand classes. Tails must not be gingered for the show. The use of artificial appliances or devices such as chains, shackles, rubber bands or blindfolds is prohibited on the show grounds during or before the show. Quarter boots are permitted in 5-gaited classes only. The show committee will bar any animal with prohibited equipment from further participation and the owners shall forfeit all entry fees and winnings for that animal for the entire show. Horses may not cross enter between divisions. All classes will be regulated according to IASPHA rules. If not covered by IASPHA, current AHSA rules will be followed.
- ✓ All checks returned by the bank and having to be resubmitted will be subject to a \$25 fee charged by IASPHA.
- ✓ Five horses are required to make a class. Classes with less than five entries may be cancelled or combined. Exhibitor's age on December 1, 2006 will be considered the age for class entry. No refunds, except on veterinarian's certificate of unfitness.

The management is not responsible for theft, damage, or accident to spectators, exhibitors, riders or horses.

Saddle & Bridle's

ASB Pleasure Equitation Medallion Class

Rules and Regulations

Eligibility See USEF Article EQ118

1. Eligibility to compete in the *Saddle & Bridle* Medallion is limited to those riders who show ONLY American Saddlebred Pleasure Horses in equitation during a given show season. This does not exclude the saddle seat equitation riders showing other breeds. Country Pleasure Horses and Show Pleasure Horses may both compete.
2. A minimum of three riders must be entered, shown and judged in order to be an official Medallion qualifying class. The Medallion and ribbons cannot be awarded if less than three are in the class. **ABSOLUTELY NO REFUNDS!** Class may be transferred for a \$5.00 fee to a show at a later date during the following season. Late charge of \$10.00 on shows ordered within 30 days of class.
3. One Medallion Class win eliminates that rider from further competition in qualifying classes that season.
4. All Medallion Class winners are eligible for the Medallion Finals scheduled to be held at St. Louis National Charity Horse Show in the fall. Riders under 13 are eligible for the junior finals. Riders between 14-17 are eligible for the senior division.
5. A rider competing in a Medallion Class will be qualified for the finals by winning or placing second. A rider who qualifies with a second place ribbon can show in other Medallion Classes. One win eliminates a rider from further competition in qualifying classes.
6. The qualifying season for 2007 ends on **September 17th**.

Saddle & Bridle's ASB Shatner Western Pleasure

Rules and Regulations See USEF Article SB149 and Chapter WS

1. Open to Amateur riders of any age riding Country Pleasure American Saddlebred Horses under western tack.
2. Country Pleasure horses must be plain shod suitable for trail riding without pads, bands, or any device between hoof and shoe. Entries must be shown with full mane and tail. Tails must not be gingered or put in any device which alters their carriage while on the grounds, before and during the show, as well as in preparation for the show entered.
3. To be shown with western equipment including any western headstall without noseband in conjunction with any standard western bit. Any stock saddle. For rider: western hat, longsleeved shirt, a necktie, kerchief or bolo tie, trousers or pants (or one piece equitation suit), chaps and boots. Spurs are optional. Martingales of any type prohibited. Hackamores or snaffles are allowed in accordance with USEF.
4. To be shown at a Flat Walk, Jog Trot and Lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint ridden with one hand on reins. (See USEF for more detail on how reins should be held). Judged 75% on manners, presence and quality, 25% on total conformation and neatness of attire. In western equipment, horses should be of good Saddlebred type, with natural head carriage, serene way of going while still being alert. Entries must be asked to halt and stand quietly on the rail. Horses must stand quietly and back readily in the lineup.
5. A minimum of three horses must be entered, shown and judged in order to be an official Shatner qualifying class. **T H E B E L T B U C K L E A N D R I B B O N S C A N N O T B E A W A R D E D I F L E S S T H A N T H R E E A R E I N T H E C L A S S . A B S O L U T E L Y N O R E F U N D S !** Class may be transferred for a \$5.00 fee to a show at a later date within the following show season. Late charge of \$10.00 on shows ordered — within 30 days of class.
6. One Shatner qualifying class first place ribbon eliminates that horse from further competition in qualifying classes that season.
7. The qualifying season for 2007 ends on September 17th.

Saddle & Bridle's Working ASB Western Pleasure

Rules and Regulations See USEF WS Chapter and USEF SB149.

1. See *Saddle & Bridle's* American Saddlebred Shatner Western Pleasure Finals, part 1.
2. See *Saddle & Bridle's* American Saddlebred Shatner Western Pleasure Finals, part 2.
3. See *Saddle & Bridle's* American Saddlebred Shatner Western Pleasure Finals, part 3.
4. To be shown at a Flat Walk, Jog Trot and Lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint ridden with one hand on reins. Judged 40% on manners, presence, conformation and quality, while working on the rail. The balance of judging (60%) to be on the ability to complete the working portion of the class. This portion shall consist of four or five obstacles to be traversed as a course. The obstacles will be determined by the show manager but must consist of approved USEF Western Trail Horse obstacles. Examples of acceptable rules are the following: a cavaletti of an appropriate type (round or flat poles directly on the ground) performed as a walk over (20-24 inches, or a trot over (3 feet apart), a stationary obstacle (such as brush, canvas, etc...), a type of bridge, a pattern performed around plants, a gate or cones, a simple change of lead or flying change at the lope, a side pass over a pole or board...After three refusals an entry must skip to the next obstacle. At all times entries must exhibit appropriate manners and horsemanship.
5. A minimum of three horses must be entered, shown and judged in order to be an official Working qualifying class. The ribbons cannot be awarded if less than three are in the class. **ABSOLUTELY NO REFUNDS!** Class may be transferred for a \$5.00 fee to a show at a later date within the following show season. Late charge of \$10.00 on shows ordered — within 30 days of class.
6. The top three ribbon winners in each qualifying class will ALL be eligible to compete at the finals. There is NO limit to the number of times that any entry may qualify for the finals.

Saddle & Bridle's ASB Hunter Seat Classic

Rules and Regulations See USEF SB149.

1. Open to Amateur riders of any age riding Country Pleasure American Saddlebred Horses under Hunter Equipment.
2. **Appointment Hunter Equipment:** Regulation snaffle, Pelham or full bridle, all with cavesson noseband. Martingales of any type are prohibited. A forward or balance seat saddle is required. Colored browbands and Cavessons are prohibited. Hunter style braiding of the mane or tail is optional.
3. For the rider, coats of any tweed or melton for hunting (conservative wash jackets in season), breeches, (or jodpurs) and boots, dark hunting cap or derby. Spurs of unrowled type, crops, or bats are optional. Extremes of temperature or climate conditions as well as locale or time of day may modify the above requirements.
4. Saddlebred Country Pleasure horses must be plain shod suitable for hunting **without pads**, bands, or any device between hoof and shoe. Entries must be shown with full mane and tail. Tails must not be gingered or put in any device which alters their carriage in preparation for the show entered.
5. Saddlebred hunter seat pleasure horses are to be shown on the flat at the walk, trot, and canter. Judges may ask eight horses at a time to hand gallop collectively one way of the ring. Horses must stand quietly, not stretched, and back readily. To be judged on manners, performance, suitability as a hunter, quality and conformation. Horses must be obedient, with smooth prompt transitions. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. The Saddlebred Hunter should wear his head in a relaxed, natural manner. Natural head carriage may vary with

the horse's conformation. As in all Saddlebred divisions, the best quality specimens of the breed should prevail.

6. Horses should be shown in the following gaits: a). Walk; true four beat and ground covering. b). Trot; low, ground covering, balanced and free moving. Posting is required. c). Canter; ground covering, free moving and smooth. d). Hand Gallop; should be definite lengthening of stride while in total control. It is recommended that a jump, not to exceed 2 feet, should be made available by show management and called for during the class, at the judge's discretion. Each show offering a Hunter Classic qualifying class must state the possibility of a jump in the show's prize list. A jump will be required at the Finals. Extreme speed to be penalized.
7. A minimum of three horses must be entered, shown and judged in order to be an official qualifying class. The silver pendant and ribbons cannot be awarded if less than three in the class. **ABSOLUTELY NO REFUNDS!** Class may be transferred for a \$5.00 fee to a show at a later date within the following show season. Late charge of \$10.00 on shows ordered — within 30 days of the class.
