- Stalls \$30.00 and \$5.00 deposit will be reimbursed when stall is cleaned before you leave
- Limited number of stalls please reserve early
- Original negative coggins and a copy required to get your number
- Age as of December 1st academy classes and January 1st for regular classes
- Classes maybe cancelled or combined at show manager's discretion
- No cross entering except class #20
- May be asked to leave by show manager for any unsportsman like conduct

Show guidelines and class descriptions

- English classes - are open to saddleseat or huntseat riders
- Novice classes - not to have won three blues in that division
- English pleasure and equitation is open to huntseat or saddleseat. Professionals not allowed
- Class #20 Hunter W-T - one 18" jump is open to regular or academy riders may cross enter in canter classes
- Open western pleasure - open to amateurs or professionals
- 2, 3 or 4 Year old Training - Open to 2, 3 or 4 year olds and will be asked to walk and trot both ways of the ring. Martingales are permitted. Open to amateurs and professionals.
- Showmanship is open to regular or academy handlers
- Patterns will be posted the day of the show
- Academy classes - open to saddleseat, huntseat or western riders
- Maiden academy - first time showing outside of school show
- Novice academy - not to have won three blues in that division
- Discipline lead line will be asked to trot a straight away, class is placed 1st-6th participation ribbons after 6th
- Lead line - everybody wins
- Must have shown in qualifier class in order to show in Championship classes

Academy:

The purpose of this division is to introduce potential owners to the joys of showing horses and give riders the opportunity to gain experience in a fun horse show atmosphere. The UPHA and Chapters 3/4 and 10 sanction these classes. A complete copy of the guidelines for these classes will be available at the horse show office.

Academy Riders:

Riders in this division are students who are enrolled in a professionally operated program and are to be judged on their basic riding skills. Riders may NOT cross enter into any performance classes with the exception of driving classes. A rider who has shown in a regular division class and/or in a full riding suite at any show is prohibited from further participation in the Academy division with the exception of the Open Rider Pleasure classes (if applicable).

Academy Riders' Attire:

All riders are encouraged to use safety helmets. ASTM/SEI Approved Safety helmets are the only acceptable headgear for academy riders. Helmets are required for ALL 10 and under riders (effective 01/07)

- Saddle Seat Attire: Jodhpurs or dark pants, shirt with a collar, tie jodhpur boots or sturdy shoes. Sweater vest or sweater permitted; no fitted vests or derbies/hats. No full riding suits allowed.
- Hunt Seat Attire: Breeches, white shirt, jodhpur boots or sturdy shoes. Sweater vest or sweater permitted; no fitted jackets.
- Western Attire: Dark pants, western type shirt or white dress shirt, tie boots absolutely no cowboy hats

Horses:

Horses are to be lesson-type horses. These horses must display the characteristics of such! Instructors are encouraged to own or lease their academy horses. Horses must not be in training. Horses may be shown in a snaffle bridle with martingale or Pelham/full bridle. Appropriate saddles are to be used for the seat being ridden. Hoof blacking and ribbon braids are optional.

Academy horses may cross-enter into other divisions at any show; however, show horses may not be entered into the academy division. This means an academy horse is allowed to show in the academy division and be cross-entered into other divisions (such as Pleasure, Country Pleasure, Pleasure Equitation) at the same show.
